# <u>A Note from Fr. Quealy</u>

We have many duties as a Catholic. These duties are also called precepts of the Church. The following explains one more duty:

*To receive Holy Communion frequently; at least once a year during the Easter Season.* 

This duty is also tied to the duty that was mentioned previously: "to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation regularly." We need to be in a state of grace and free from sin, especially mortal sin, before we can receive Our Lord. (NB: a person in a state of *mortal sin* is never allowed to receive communion, until they are forgiven in confession.)

The penitential rite at the beginning of Mass does <u>not</u> "forgive sins", it however allows the (venial) minor sins which we may have committed since our last confession, to be set aside, allowing us to receive Communion, but only with the understanding that we will go to confession as soon as we are able to.

Remember, that ever since the Last Supper when our Lord Jesus gave us His very self, the Sacrament of Holy Communion is a precious gift which we must devotedly love and respect.

Included in this Bulletin is an excellent explanation of "Who can go to Communion." Please take the time to read this insert and keep it available for future reference.

## A PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY *by Rev. William J. Reilly* Fifth Sunday of Lent - March 18, 2018

"Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip who was from Bethsaida in Galilee and asked him 'Sir we would like to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew, then Philip and Andrew went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them 'the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit.'"

It is not rare for someone to use another to get help to get a job, admission to school, or even just to meet someone of importance. In the political field we call them lobbyists. Today we find some Gentiles using Philip, and he and another apostle to gain access to Jesus. The same Andrew is the one who told Peter he had met Jesus and we know how important that meeting was.

How many other persons are seeking Jesus, today without knowing it or Him. They have need for access to the Lord. Our restless world turns, but people do not know to whom to turn. Each one of us can assume the role of Philip or Andrew, to bring them to Jesus or Jesus to them. The grain of wheat will then produce much fruit.
