- 2) Repairing the Convent

- 8) 2nd bank loan of \$153k was paid off the day before Thanksgiving. Archdiocesan debt is in the wings.

 - o Fr. Quealy we have to still pay the diocesan debt. \$2,400 every 3 months.
 - O Also, Capital Campaign is coming up. The capital campaign we had 10 years ago was forgiven because this church was being built. This year, CC will be earmarked for Capital needs of parish. We have our list of things we need to get done so we will raise money for that and anything we raise above that will be set aside for future needs.
